



Citizenship (working with others)

To demonstrate competence in Citizenship, your evidence must show that you can ...

- think about other people's feelings
- listen to other people carefully and think about what they say
- support other people and help them to learn
- behave in an appropriate manner
- take an active part in discussion or debate



Enterprise (problem solving)

To demonstrate competence in Enterprise, your evidence must show that you can ...

- plan what you need to do in order to solve the problem
- work to and meet deadlines
- think of good ideas and present them clearly to others
- work effectively as a leader and a team player in a group
- take risks and persevere when trying out new ideas in your learning



Information (improving own learning)

To demonstrate competence in Information, your evidence must show that you can ...

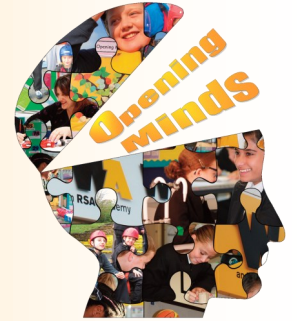
- follow instructions to support your planning
- find out information from a variety of sources
- use the information you have selected well and present it logically and appropriately
- reflect on the relevance of the information you have collected



Learning (improving own learning)

To demonstrate competence in Learning, your evidence must show that you can ...

- recognise a skill which you have improved or which needs further development
- accept praise and constructive criticism when evaluating your learning
- understand your strengths and weaknesses and set SMART targets for yourself
- identify how you learn best and use this information to improve your performance



People (working with others)

To demonstrate competence in People, your evidence must show that you can ...

- develop co-operation and productivity in your team through conflict resolution
- listen to others carefully and consider their opinions and ideas
- identify your own responsibilities in the team
- identify where there is room for improvement or development in your team



Situations (problem solving)

To demonstrate competence in Situations, your evidence must show that you can ...

- use your time well, prioritising actions and resources
- celebrate your success and achievement and learn to manage disappointments
- work without close supervision to complete a task and develop your independence
