

Web Design

Students will start this project by completing a research sheet about web design and features of different websites that they may not know the correct terminology for (Banner, Navigation Bar, Homepage). They will then complete a project planning sheet about their chosen website topic they will make a plan for 4-6 pages. After completing the planning sheet, they will be introduced to the project planning technique of using a mood board. They will then create their web page designs using PowerPoint. After the planning stage they will be introduced to some basics of Dreamweaver (web authoring software) and start to create their websites using this software.

Home Learning:

Students are expected to explore websites in their own time so they can confidently identify different elements of web pages.

Key Questions: (A list of key questions)

- Why is it important to know your audience when creating a website?
- What are the different purposes of websites?
- What are the different website features shown on most websites?
- Why is it important to use planning techniques to plan projects?
- What's a mood board?
- Why is it important to create a structure diagram?
- What features of Dreamweaver are we using?

Diagnosis

& Smith Proforma

- Students to discuss audience, purpose and features of websites to establish what they know/don't know.

Therapy

- Students to be shown the different elements that make up a web page.
- Students to be introduced to some basics of project planning.
- Demonstrations of basic features of Dreamweaver that allows the students to create websites.
- Peer and self-assessment tasks to deepen understanding of content.

Students will: (Success Criteria)

- Be able to complete a research sheet about websites.
- Know the different audiences and purposes of websites.
- Name the basic features of a website.
- Create a mood board to help influence planning decisions.
- Create a page plan on PowerPoint and explain why it is useful.
- Develop a new skillset on Dreamweaver.
- Develop a basic website on Dreamweaver.

Testing

- Students will complete an assessment in the middle and at the end of the unit to demonstrate the skills they have learnt
